NOTE: As you know, Jewel doesn't allow you to go backwards to fix mistakes, so if you find a mistake, you sometimes need auditor help. I say sometimes, because there <u>are</u> things that you can fix on your own, even from previous months, if you know how, or want to learn how. Things like:
